<u>S487-2013 Cessation of access to the Ultranet on 19 December 2013</u> 19 December will be the last day that schools will be able to access the Ultranet in 2013. Schools choosing not to continue access in 2014 through NEC will need to ensure they have extracted any content, records or data that they wish to keep, or are required to keep, by that date.
